Reporting directly to the Principal, teachers are responsible for advancing the educational standards and efficiency of the school, participating in educational planning, and continuously developing personal professional competence.

Qualifications

- Valid Saskatchewan “Professional A” teacher’s certificate.
- Bachelor of Education degree from a recognized program of study.
- Registered with the Saskatchewan Professional Teachers Regulatory Board.
- Demonstrate a personal commitment to the Protestant Christian faith and participate in a Christian church community.
- Christ-centred educational philosophy.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to work collaboratively with colleagues, parents, and students.
- Commitment to ongoing professional growth and development.
- Satisfactory criminal record check with vulnerable sector search.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Model a Christ-centred life and intentionally incorporate Protestant Christian faith into teaching practice and educational philosophy.
- Teach assigned curriculum and design learning activities to address diverse student needs.
- Create and maintain an inclusive, respectful, and engaging classroom atmosphere that supports student participation and discipline.
- Work closely with colleagues and school leadership on instructional planning, student support, and school-wide initiatives.
- Accurately track attendance and student progress and communicate regularly with parents/guardians regarding academic and behavioural concerns.
- Evaluate student performance and promote academic progress congruent with school policies and the principal’s guidance.
- Attend staff meetings, contribute to school activities, and support the broader goals of the school community.
- Participate in ongoing professional development to enhance instructional practices and classroom management skills.
- Adhere to division administrative procedures, government regulations, and section 231 of *The Education Act, 1995*, in all professional duties and responsibilities.
