DAILY VISITOR PROTOCOL INFORMATION

The purpose of the Daily Visitor Protocol Information is to help inform our visitors of required protocols to visit SCS during the COVID-19 pandemic so we can continue to provide a safe environment for staff, students, families, and visitors.

At every visit, all visitors must:

- Wear a mask at all times when in the building.
- Complete hand hygiene (wash for 30 seconds and/or use hand sanitizer).
- Report to Reception and sign in and out on the Daily Visitor Log.
- Only visit their own child(ren). Visitation with other students is not permitted at this time.

At every visit, individuals entering the building to perform a service must also:

- provide government issued picture identification, and either proof of full vaccination or evidence of a valid negative COVID-19 test performed by a Ministry-authorized facility within the previous 7 days.

COVID-19 Screening Questions:

The form only relates to unexplained, new, or worsening symptoms (even mild symptoms), including the following: fever, cough, headache, muscle and/or joint aches and pains, sore throat, chills, runny nose, nasal congestion, conjunctivitis, dizziness, fatigue, nausea/vomiting, diarrhea, loss of appetite (difficulty feeding for children), loss of sense of taste or smell, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing.

If you answer “YES” to either COVID-19 screening questions, you are not permitted to visit SCS at this time.

If you answer “NO” to both COVID-19 screening questions, please sign the Daily Visitor Log and proceed with your visit.

By signing the Daily Visitor Log, I acknowledge that I have read, understood, and will comply with the Daily Visitor Protocol Information as outlined above and that to the best of my knowledge, I can truthfully answer “NO” to the COVID-19 screening questions.
